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Program Letter of Agreement (PLA)

- I. This document serves as the Program Letter of Agreement between the Chiang Mai University, Department of Pediatrics Faculty of Medicine and the University of Arizona's Pediatric and Pediatrics/EM Residency Programs involved in resident/fellowship education for required assignments.

This PLA is effective from 09/01/2017, and will remain in effect for five years or until updated, changed or terminated by the parties involved.

II. Items of Agreement

- A. Designation of Program Director ("Program Director") is Sean Elliott, M.D. The Program Director has responsibility for the general administration of the program, including those activities related to the recruitment, selection, instruction, supervision, counseling, evaluation, discipline and advancement of trainees and the maintenance of records related to program accreditation. The Program Director is ultimately responsible for the assignment of residents' clinical educational rotations.

The above mentioned individuals/group are responsible to provide appropriate supervision of the residents and/or fellows in patient care activities and maintain a learning environment conducive to educating trainees in the ACGME competency areas. The faculty must evaluate trainee performance in a timely manner during each rotation or similar educational assignment and document this evaluation at completion of the assignment.


- C. Educational Goals and Objectives have been developed according to ACGME Program Requirements and include the following (or are delineated in the attached document):
1) Expose residents to a large research-based medical center in Thailand that has a diverse patient population; 2) Observe and participate in the care of patients with diseases they would be unlikely to see in the United States, and 3) Create networks with medical professionals in Chang Mai for future collaborations in research and medical education.
- D. Assignment of Program Participants In cooperation with Sean Elliott, MD, Orawan Louthrenoo, MD and the faculty at Chiang Mai University are responsible for the day-to-day activities of the trainee(s) to ensure that the outlined goals and objectives are met during the course of the educational experience.

The duration of the assignment to Chiang Mai University is one month for PGY-2s and PGY-3s.






